Zonta Celebrates International Women's Day 2021 By Celebrating Women In The Community. The Zonta Club of Oakville is celebrating and supporting International Women's Day with the launch of their EVERYTHING'S COMING UP ROSES campaign.

From January 15 until March 8, 2021, this new initiative is designed to encourage people to celebrate the special women in their life and raise awareness of International Women's Day. International Women's day is celebrated globally on March 8.

Since its inception in 1973, the Zonta Club of Oakville has been building community awareness for International Women's Day. In the last two years, the club raised over \$75,000 for the Oakville Hospital Foundation at its sold-out galas. This year, the celebration will be COVID-friendly with the goal to fill social media feeds and mailboxes with greeting cards and messages of gratitude.

As part of the social media campaign, the community is encouraged to identify the women in their life who have had a positive impact, using the hashtag #ZontaRose. Social media users can follow the campaign on Facebook, Instagram, Twitter and LinkedIn platforms. Zonta Oakville is also encouraging supporters to purchase a package of 'I CELEBRATE YOU' yellow rose greeting cards to send to the important women in their lives. A package of 5 cards is \$30, with tax receipts issued for \$25. They are available at zontacelebrates.ca. The fundraising proceeds will go to the Oakville Hospital Foundation and women's charities

In addition, the Downtown Oakville BIA will be supporting the initiative with WE CELEBRATE INTERNATIONAL WOMEN'S DAY posters in their shop windows. There will also be an instagrammable yellow rose display in Towne Square from March 5 - 8 2021.

"International Women's Day has always been an important fundraising event for the Zonta Club of Oakville," said Kathy Mundy, Zonta Event Co-Chair. "With the current pandemic and social distancing, our club has had to rethink how we can still celebrate women while supporting women's charities. The Zonta Rose campaign is an impactful, fun and creative way to celebrate all the Zonta Roses who make our community extraordinary."

The Zonta Club of Oakville is made up of a small but vibrant group of professional women, that work together to assist women in the Halton community and internationally. The organization works with charitable partners to provide emergency housing, financial aid, educational support, and mental and physical services to women in need.
